ESPO Meeting Notes Wednesday, January 18, 2017

- 1. Welcome Remarks and Introductions: Elizabeth Caswell
- 2. **Emerson Auction**: Lorna Hildebrandt
 - The Emerson Auction will be held on Friday, March 10 at Barton Hills Country Club. The theme is: World of Possibilities, coordinating with the upcoming Passport to the World event. Invitations will be coming out soon.
 - Lorna shared that all Auction leadership positions have been filled.
 She thanked the leadership team and volunteers! All committees are up and running.
 - Kicking off acquisition work. Deadline to sponsor a teacher is Friday, January 20. The advertising deadline is February 6. Information will be coming soon about other ways to donate.

3. Coordinating Committee Reports

- a. **Budget Review**: Elizabeth Caswell for Annie Bruienne ESPO has two primary sources of income 1) dues and 2) pizza lunch. Our income allows ESPO to invest in the school in whatever way the school needs. Investments range from small (Lost and Found improvements) to large (\$100,000 to the Arts and Innovation Center over 5 years). Our budget also covers the expenses for events such as Halloween and Field Day. One major new ESPO expense is the Back to School picnic, which is free to all families and faculty. This is a great event for families and staff, but it is expensive. Our dues don't cover all of our expenses.
- b. 2017-2018 Dues, Enrichment and Grants: Elizabeth Caswell
 - i. *Dues*: Coordinating Committee voted to increase dues to \$35 per family (moderate increase). Even with this increase in dues we will still be dipping into pizza income to pay for events.
 - ii. *Enrichment*: We have set Enrichment money aside for special speakers and events. Last year we paid for performances by Wild Swan Theatre at Emerson, such as "Rosie the Riveter." We are reviewing requests for this year.
 - iii. Grants: We invited teachers to apply for grants for their classrooms. ESPO Coordinating Committee and Emerson Administration reviewed the grant requests from teachers. Teachers had creative ways of enhancing their curriculum.
 \$1,500 will be divided among three recipients. We will share the details in March.

 school library. Linda will use this money to purchase books at a
 discounted price from Nicola's. ESPO covers the event expenses.
- b. **Bake Sale**: Maria Bichakjian and Jeanne Cooper
 The Bake Sale made \$2,200, which was a little less than last year. The
 money raised goes to the Technology Department and was used to
 purchase iPad minis for the Learning Support Program. Maria thanked
 everyone for their donations and volunteering.
- c. **Passport to the World**: Christine Kim
 Passport to the World is coming up on April 21. This is an event that
 we hold every three years. It is a very fun evening. The gym is filled
 with booths representing different countries. Parents, teachers, and
 students are involved. The evening includes food, entertainment and
 speakers representing different countries. We will be looking for

ESPO Guest Speaker: Dr. Lauer

John Huber introduced our speaker, Dr. Roger Lauer. Dr. Lauer is the Director of the Center for Neuropsychology, Learning and Development in Ann Arbor. John shared some of Dr. Lauer's many educational and professional credentials. Dr. Lauer spoke at an ESPO meeting last year and was kind enough to return. Dr. Lauer and Emerson School have an excellent partnership, with a common goal of best supporting our students.

The topic of Dr. Lauer's talk was: *Raising Confident Sons: So Many Theories, So Little Time.* In brief, Dr. Lauer's talk included discussion of gender identity, and the influences of socialization and stereotypes on boys' behavior. Dr. Lauer stressed the importance of supporting our kids—acceptance and inclusion are key. Dr. Lauer also discussed how to support boys at school and home, including helping boys develop emotional literacy.
